First, I would like to express my total admiration at your courage to come forward with what is obviously a very difficult subject and memory for you to handle. I can only imagine how hard it must have been to reveal such a terrible incident, especially when the person you say did it is now the President of the United States.

I would like to extend an invitation for you to be a guest on "The Roseanne Show" to talk with me about what happened that day in the hotel room and how you got the strength to deal with it for over twenty years.

Last Fall, I conducted one of the first interviews with Paula Jones, another woman who has been met with criticism for "daring" to speak out about Bill Clinton. As in your situation, there were people who would have rather she said nothing about what happened to her years ago. I believe ignoring or trying to silence women like yourself and Ms Jones is as bad as the offenses that you both say were committed against the two of you. I believe the nation has a right to hear what you have to say and decide for themselves whether they want to believe you or not.
